Maurizio Garibaldi is een derde-generatie-immigrant uit Italië, met een bewogen familiegeschiedenis in de Chileense wijnbouw. Het door zijn grootvader in 1945 gekochte familiewijngoed werd in 1972 – net als veel andere wijngoederen – onteigend door het regime van Salvador Allende. Maurizio heeft het wijnvak weer opgepakt met kleinschalig wijnmaken, iets waar Chili, met zijn grote producenten, veel behoefte aan

heeft. Hij is inmiddels een van de rijzende sterren van de Chileense wijnwereld. MEININGER'S WINE BUSINESS INTERNATIONAL CASABLANCA GROWS UP

Eduardo Brethauer charts the rise of Casablanca in Chile, which is navigating a quality revolution alongside water and labour shortages.

It's hardly really known that Casablanca is a Chilean wine region. The most plausible memory people of a large wine house that watched over the city's vineyards of dairy cows. While the house no longer exists, Casablanca is today recognized as a Chilean wine region. It's a valley with almost 4,000 hectares of vine, recognized as the first coastal or cold climate D.O. in Chile. It's also a beautiful region and a part of the wine region of the 10 Great Wine Capitals of the world.

The town of Casablanca – founded in 1733 as Santa Felipe de Casablanca in honour of the city of the Spanish king Ferdinand II – was named the capital of the valley. Then it was a haven of eight-armed monks and women who lived with colonial rule and a church that had the town's history. The town was a place of refuge for a cold, dark, rainy and warm the town, after a three-day pilgrimage along a dusty, mountainous track that connected the valley to the sea between the capital Santiago and Valparaíso.

Although there was some winemaking activity, such as the small estate called dedicated to the saints. But, in the 1980s, the wine made its debut. Higher quality wines were made only by the first of the first and then by the second. Commercial winemaking had to wait until the 1980s, when the former Caracal's son, Fernando Pérez, started to look for a valley with the conditions to produce wines. Despite the warnings of the locals, he found his way to the Casablanca valley due to its proximity to the capital and because the mountains and coastal waters provided him with the landscape of Casablanca.

SAUVIGNON BLANC

2018

Casablanca Valley. Originating 18.5 km in a straight line from the sea, its location greatly influences the aromatic profile of the wine. It was harvested a little later to obtain a perfect balance between alcohol and acidity. This wine was fermented 30% in French oak barrels, with 11 months on its lees, to obtain greater volume and creaminess. The remaining percentage of the wine was fermented in stainless steel.

100% Sauvignon Blanc

VINEYARD PRODUCTION:

• 9 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

• Alcohol: 12,5% • pH: 3,24
• Total Acidity: 7,33 g/l • Residual Sugar: 2,09 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 8 - 12 ° C.

This wine offers aromas of white flowers, citrus, quince, gooseberry, peach, lychee, juniper, melon, cactus fruit, and apple, all balanced by a distinct minerality. On the palate it is soft and creamy but lively, with a salty and mineral touch on the finish. The ample fruit can suggest sweetness, but this wine is totally dry, without residual sugar. This wine embraces the freshness of the land it comes from.

EARLY HARVEST

Durif/Syrah/Malbec

2018

Maipo Valley. In these vineyards, whose setting is marked by forests and the maritime winds that come from the south, a fresh wine emerged, with great acidity and barrel-fermented to bring complexity and structure.

Fermented and aged in French oak barrels, fermentation at moderate temperatures (13-16 ° C), and, like the Sauvignon Blanc, sat on the lees to achieve greater volume in the mouth.

The complex nose shows fresh aromas of rose and cherry, and buttery notes. This is elegant wine on the palate, showing freshness and volume with a long and refined finish.

Some dishes to accompany:

Tuna tartare, grilled octopus, duck confit, roast pork, seared foie gras.

RED BLEND

Malbec/Syrah/Durif

2016

A red blend from Maipo Costa Valley. Rises 800 meters above sea level and 41 km from the coast, in the Maipo Valley, where the South Pacific winds build intensity as they climb and flow through hills surrounded by forests, delaying the ripening of the grape. As complex as the forest that shelters it, invites us to let ourselves be enveloped by its personality and taste.

VINEYARD PRODUCTION:

• 4 – 6 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

• Alcohol: 13,6%

• pH: 3,6

• Total Acidity: 5,32 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 16 – 18° C.

This wine was aged for 20 months in French oak barrels and another 2 years in the bottle. The predominant notes are violet, cherry, blackberry, raspberry, currant, hazelnut, leather. It is an intense and lively wine that shows new layers as it opens up.

Some dishes to accompany: Braised lamb shank, duck, wild boar, ossobuco, grilled Wagyu beef.

NEW RELEASE



PAÍS

2020

Pais. Bio-Bio Valley. These east-facing vineyards with their 250-year-old vines are located on the banks of the River Bio-Bio, 51km from the ocean. As with my other wines, the grapes were hand-harvested. They come from dry-farmed, bush-trained vines in vineyards that are traditionally managed, without chemicals and ploughed by horse. Being so close to the river, the soils are washed-out, poor sandy loam. The fermentation included 20% whole clusters and, as with my other wines, it spent 1 month in contact with the skins and 2 years ageing in used French oak barrels.

• 9 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

- Alcohol: 12,7 %
- pH: 3,73
- Total Acidity: 4,14 g/l
- Residual Sugar: 1,45 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 13- 17 °C.

The nose is very floral and fresh with pronounced minerality that really expresses the River Bio-Bio. Beautiful white pepper lift and sweet strawberry fruit, raspberries and mint and other fresh herbs come through. The mouth is lively and delicate with very elegant acidity, fabulous silky texture.

CINSAULT

2020

Cinsault. Itata Valley. As is the case with the Pais wine, the grapes for this wine come from 60-year-old vines that are dry-farmed and bush-trained. The west-facing vineyard is located at an altitude of 250 metres and just 21km from the ocean, so it is constantly refreshed by breezes blowing in from the sea and the River Itata. The soils are sandy loam containing granite and iron. As is the case for all my wines, the grapes were hand-harvested. The fermentation included 30% whole clusters and, as with my other wines, it spent 1 month in contact with the skins and 2 years ageing in used French oak barrels.

• 8 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

- Alcohol: 11,9 %
- pH: 3,56
- Total Acidity: 3,71 g/l
- Residual Sugar: 1,88 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 13- 17 °C.

On the nose, this wine is fresh, floral, meaty, prune lifted with notes of mandarins, cherries and grapefruit, followed by raspberries, apricots and plums. In the mouth, it reveals vibrant, savoury palate firm acidity and lovely fine Cinsault tannins, crunchy stalky vibrancy that lend it character and personality.

Itata Valley - Chile



PINOT NOIR

2020

Pinot Noir. Leyda Valley. This wine comes from a vineyard just 14km from the ocean and its location greatly influences its aromatic profile. The wine is the result of my exploration of new areas. The 2020 vintage is my second vintage of Pinot Noir but the first from an organic vineyard in the Leyda Valley, just like the Garnacha and the Syrah. The soil at this vineyard is poor and contains granite, which lends the wine delicate, well-balanced fruit aromas.

VINEYARD PRODUCTION:

• 7 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

- Alcohol: 12,9%
- Total Acidity: 4,32 g/l
- pH: 3,68
- Residual Sugar: 1,92 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 13- 16 ° C.

This wine offers aromas of fresh rosemary, mint, lavender, violets, dill, tarragon, raspberry, blueberry, cranberries and rose petals, all balanced by a distinct minerality. On the palate it is soft and creamy but lively, with an elegant and very long finish.

Leyda Valley - Chile

GARNACHA

2020

Garnacha. Leyda Valley. The grapes are from the same vineyard as the Pinot Noir but at a higher altitude (260 metres above sea level), on a small hill in the Cordon Huinca, part of the Coastal Mountain Range. The vineyard faces north-east and is 14km from the ocean. The soils are deep and granitic, mainly granodiorites (with at least 20% quartz), mixed with other iron-rich clay. The fermentation included 46% whole clusters and, as with my other wines, it spent 1 month in contact with the skins and 2 years ageing in French oak barrels that had already been used at least 4 times.

100% Garnacha

VINEYARD PRODUCTION:

• 6 ton/ha.

ANALYSIS:

- Alcohol: 12 %
- Total Acidity: 3,19 g/l
- pH: 3,78
- Residual Sugar: 1,33 g/l

Serving Temperature: Serve between 16- 19 ° C.

The nose displays aromas of violets, raspberries and blueberries. On the palate, it is soft, with juicy acidity and pronounced, well-integrated and plush tannins that make this a very elegant wine with a very long finish.

Leyda Valley - Chile



SYRAH

2021

Syrah. Leyda Valley. This Syrah comes from the same vineyard as the Pinot Noir and Garnacha. It was the first Syrah planted in the foothills of the Leyda Valley at an altitude of 230 metres above sea level. The vineyard faces north-east and is subject to a significant maritime influence with cloudy mornings that slow down the grape-ripening process. As the vines are 15 years old, their yields are low, but the grapes are deliciously concentrated. The fermentation included 15% whole clusters and, as with my other wines, it spent 1 month in contact with the skins and 1 year ageing in French oak barrels that had already been used at least 5 times.

The nose is very expressive with elegant notes of cool-climate Syrah. Aromas of blackberries, blueberries, raspberries and spices are followed by notes of black olives and pepper. In the mouth, it is smooth with racy acidity that combines with the tannins to give backbone to this long and very fine wine.

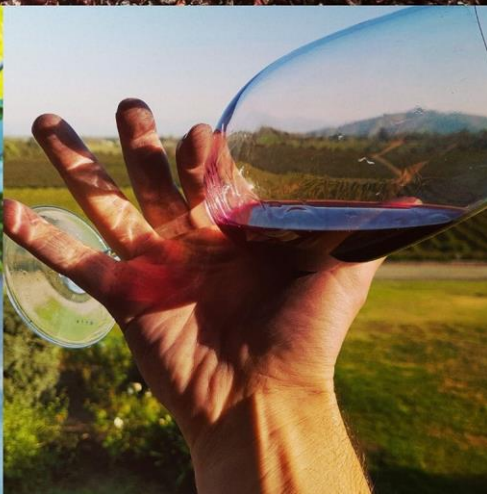
Young Winemaker of the Year 2020 Maurizio Garibaldi of Maurizio Garibaldi Wines

- 93 pts. Sauvignon Blanc 2018.** Light, refreshing and tangy, with a hint of nutmeg spice and flavours of lemongrass and pink grapefruit. saline white of considerable distinction, showing notes of nettle, elderflower and pink grapefruit. Long, refreshing and bone dry.”
- 92 pts. Rosé 2018** “Always among Chile's best and most unusual rosados, this is a smoky, old barrel-fermented cuvée of Durif, Syrah, Malbec. Raspberry and grapefruit flavours combine intriguingly on the palate.”
- 94 pts. Pinot Noir 2018** “This is a superb Pinot Noir from Maurizio Garibaldi, made from the 777 clones grown in a cool part of Casablanca. Fermented with 50% whole bunches, it's a rose petal and Turkish Delight scented wonder, with some pepper spice notes, very subtle wood and layers of raspberry and wild strawberry underpinned by stony minerality.”
- 92 pts. Lemu 2016** “Formerly labelled as Lemu, this comes from a vineyard at 750 meters in the Maipo Costa region and is a deeply coloured blend of Malbec with 23% each of Durif and Syrah. Firm, muscular tannins, some clove spice from whole bunches and damson and black cherry fruit.”

Robert Parker - Luis Gutiérrez

- 93 pts. Sauvignon Blanc 2018** “..It's made with fruit from the south of Casablanca and follows in the line of the 2016 I tasted last time, also a cooler year when he harvested early to achieve a good balance between ripeness and acidity. The wine has even lower alcohol and feels quite sharp, with a higher percentage fermented in used barrels to give it more volume. This is more citrusy than floral, but it's also less herbal and has a tasty, almost salty touch on the finish. Persistent and quite remarkable. 6,383 bottles were filled in March 2019. This should age nicely in bottle.”
- 91 pts. Rosé 2018** “smells quite a lot like herbal and tomato vine, with a lot of peach and some spices. It fermented in barrel and was kept with the lees for 10 months. This is quite crazy... I'd be curious to see how this evolves in bottle. If you want an unusual rosé, this is for you. 4,772 bottles were filled in March 2019.”
- 93 pts. Pinot Noir 2018** “ The nose is very expressive and floral, and it has a vibrant palate with fine-grained tannins, very expressive and tasty. A notable addition to the portfolio. 1,398 bottles were filled in February 2019.”
- 92 pts. Lemu 2016** “...has very good freshness. Duriff has explosive fruit and flowers, while the Syrah gives it a spicy twist and the Malbec a velvety texture. This has character and is quite original, with a balanced, tasty palate with fine, slightly dusty tannins. 8,266 bottles were filled in February 2018.”

This is an interesting new producer to follow.
